ACM Solid and Physical Modeling Symposium 2008 (SPM'08) will be held on June 2-4, 2008, in Stony Brook University, Stony Brook, New York, USA.

This highly successful conference series have been a primary venue for disseminating research results and exchanging new ideas in geometric and solid modeling, physical modeling, geometric design, analysis, simulation and processing, shape computing and visualization, and various applications.
